Step 2: If diagnosed, you may be entitled to Attendance Allowance funding. Talk to Health & Social Care Connect. It is not means-tested.

They can help complete the assessment forms. HSCC can also provide details of the Dementia Support Service.

Alternatively, STEPS may be able to guide you through the Attendance Allowance funding and other processes/applications (telephone 01323 436 414).

May we also suggest you see a solicitor about Lasting Power of Attorney and updating your Will.

You may be entitled to:

- Council Tax Reduction.
- A Blue Badge.
